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W. Bil called the meeting to order at 2:00 PM. He advised that he was chairing the meeting pursuant to section 105(13) of the Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act. He had reviewed claims and was able to declare that the meeting was properly called, a quorum was present and the meeting was duly constituted.

The following documents were tabled:

- Proposal
- Statement of Affairs
- Trustee's Preliminary Report to Creditors
- Proof of Mailing of Notices

Bil advised that the purpose of the meeting was to consider the Proposal of Mr. Warke and to vote thereon. However, he understood that at least one of the creditors would be asking for an adjournment of the meeting to further review of the affairs of the Proponent.

The meeting was opened to discussion.

In response to a question from Poulsen, Warke and Barnes explained in general terms the financing, security and disposition of proceeds in respect of the Proposal and the new mortgage on Mrs. Warke's residence.

The \$975,000 first mortgage will be used to pay off the existing first in favour of CIBC in the approximate amount of \$345,000 for Warke. That leaves \$630,000. \$530,000 of that amount will be paid to Revenue Canada on account of Mrs. Warke's liability. The remaining \$100,000 approximately will be used for personal expenses and to fund Warke's monthly cash shortfall.

The existing second mortgage will remain in place. This is made up of \$275,000 as a contingent liability of Augusta Financial Corp. and \$100,000 in respect of Warke's direct loan from CIBC. On the Statement of Affairs this is shown as unsecured because in Warke's estate there is no security. The security is that of Mrs. Warke's.

There were further questions regarding Warke's transfer of the residence to Mrs. Warke, the valuation of the residence, the purchase price and the date of Warke's insolvency. Revenue Canada also had a number of questions. McLean indicated that the information had been previously provided and suggested the creditors put their questions in writing, following which he and Warke would attempt to deal with them.

The meeting then discussed an adjournment for either 2 or 4 weeks. McLean and Warke asked for the shorter period as the matter had already been under consideration for over 6 months. Poulsen and Revenue Canada both requested 30 days but it was agree to adjourn for 2 weeks, and if all parties agreed, the matter could be put forward an additional 2 weeks without the necessity of meeting to formally defer the adjourned meeting.

The meeting was adjourned until 2:00 PM Tuesday, October 13, 1998.
